Departure Time

Departure time is 10.00 am. We would be very grateful if you would adhere to this time as this allows us time to prepare the property for the next guests.

Clean Bed Linen and Towels

Fresh linen and bathroom towels are provided on Saturdays, which is changeover day. If your stay is for two weeks, then fresh linen and towels will be provided on your second Saturday. Please contact the housekeeper to arrange a suitable time to do so.

Heating

We have air source heating and underfloor heating for your comfort and convenience. Each room has its own thermostat to control the temperature there. Simply use the up and down buttons to set your desired temperature, and the system will do the rest.

Water Heating

The air source heating also caters for hot water. You don't need to do anything, other than turn on the hot tap!

Fuse Box

The fuse box is located in the utility room but you shouldn't need to go near this during your stay.

Parking

We have plenty of car parking at Haveli so help yourself! We have a 7Kw electric car (EV) charger on the side of the house. Please feel free to use this but you'll need to bring your own cable!

Dogs

We love dogs and they are welcome to stay at Haveli! But please let us know if you are bringing your furry friend before your stay.

Please keep your pet under control and clear up after them. Pets are not permitted in the bedrooms or on the furniture. Please do not leave your pet in the property unsupervised, as this can result in considerable damage to the property and distress to the pet.

Houses and Gardens of Interest

- Trereife House, in Penzance, Cornwall, has it all. A beautiful Manor House, stunning gardens, interesting and romantic history and a wonderfully warm welcome. When you visit Trereife House and garden, you're in for a treat. Tours, led by the owner of the house and descendent of the original owners, Tim le Grice, will give you a fascinating insight into the estate's Queen Anne architecture, history and previous owners.
